Urban Development

Housing

Egypt social housing projects should expand to the new cities during 2024.

New Cities

President Abdel Fattah al-Sissi <u>inaugurated his third term at the New Administrative Capital</u> on April 2.

While attending the Arab Military Equestrian Championship in the <u>Olympic Games City</u>, the President pointed out that the Olympic city had been built in just 5 years.

Ras al-Hikma

The <u>second installment</u> of the Ras al-Hikma deal should arrive in Egypt within April.

A similar project is discussed to develop <u>Ras Gamila</u> on the Red Sea, but nothing will begin before impact studies are carried out.

Power Cuts

While <u>power cuts</u> were on hold during Ramadan, they resume in April and should last one hour a day. The government fears <u>a hike</u> in electricity consumption as temperatures rise (see the <u>July 2023</u> <u>Press review</u>). Moreover, <u>national projects</u> increased the pressure on electricity infrastructure, according to the government spokesperson, who added that <u>no limitation date</u> could be fixed at present. In some <u>villages</u>, power cuts last up to 3 hours.

According to the government, power cuts and electricity-saving measures could <u>save \$1 billion</u> <u>yearly</u>.

While the <u>New Administrative Capital</u> is also concerned, <u>hospitals and vital facilities</u> are exempted and <u>churches</u> will be spared during the week of Easter.

In an attempt to reduce electricity consumption, the country switches to <u>summer time</u> on Friday 26. New <u>opening hours</u> are planned for stores, restaurants and cafés.

Others

Major development projects are planned in <u>Siwa</u> for a cost of EGP 3 billion, notably to improve the irrigation and drainage system.

According to <u>Mada Masr</u>, burials stopped in Bab el-Nasr cemetery; destruction is planned in this part of the City of the Dead. Burials also stopped in the <u>Sayyeda Nafissa and Imam al-Shafai</u> areas. A <u>new law on cemeteries</u> is currently debated in Parliament.

The Cairo governorate launched a campaign to fight the <u>encroachment of cafés and street vendors</u> on public spaces in Abdeen, Al-Musky, Bab Shareyya, and Nasr City.

Transportation

The Transport Ministry hopes to operate the first phase of the <u>monorail</u> by the end of 2024. The General Authority for Roads and Bridges doubled spending on development and maintenance work on the old <u>road network</u> to EGP 4 billion.

The Cairo Governor ordered the removal of some <u>signs installed on building facades</u> along the Ring Road after accusations of plagiarism. Similar charges for the decoration of a metro station led to the conviction of the artist Ghada Wali (see the <u>January/February 2024 Press review</u>), whose <u>appeal</u> will be heard on June 9.

Tourism

The country tries to rebrand greater Cairo as a tourist destination. The goal is to push visitors to extend their stay to around 12 days. Six touristic itineraries are under development.

A <u>walkway</u> will be built between the new Grand Egyptian Museum and the Pyramids of Giza. The latter welcomed <u>35,000 visitors</u> during Eid el-Fitr.

Environment

The government fixed new prices for <u>garbage collection</u> in residential areas.
